

SELF-HAULING REMINDER

All Loads Must be Properly Covered and Secured

- All vehicles arriving at the Buena Vista Landfill or Ben Lomond
 Transfer Station must have loads properly secured. Materials
 escaping from vehicles during transport are a road hazard, a primary
 source of litter, and a violation of state law. If your load is not properly
 secured, you will pay an uncovered/unsecured load fee. The fee is
 used to clean up litter on County roadways.
- Customers conducting business at the County landfill/transfer station must unload their materials by 3:45 PM. A special handle rate may apply if you are unable to unload by 3:45 PM.





NOW IS THE TIME FOR ZERO FOOD WASTE

According to the U.S. EPA, Americans throw away an estimated 25% of the food they bring home. 40% of all food produced in the U.S. is wasted. Wasteful food habits are expensive and harmful to the environment. When food waste is buried in the landfill it breaks down anaerobically (without air) and produces methane gas; a "super pollutant" that is 84% more potent than carbon dioxide (Co2). Here are ways to reduce food waste:

- Inventory your refrigerator, freezer and pantry make a shopping list and only buy what you need.
- Properly store fruits, herbs and vegetables to extend their shelf life.
- Eat older food and leftovers first or freeze them date items and rotate.
- Find creative ways to use food scraps, like making croutons from bread crust or creating a soup stock from vegetable tops.

HOLIDAY TREE PICK-UP 2023

During the first three (3) collection weeks of each year, customers may place un-flocked and undecorated holiday trees curbside for pick-up on their normal collection day. Trees must be cut into sections no larger than 6' and placed next to their organics cart. Tips for Using Your Organics Cart

- Save your food waste in a container from GreenWaste (call to request) or in a reusable container. To minimize smells in your green cart, put food waste out on collection day.
- · Before adding food to your green cart, add a layer of yard trimmings or sprinkle with baking soda.
- Do your neighbors have extra yard waste? Offer your cart to improve your food/yard waste layers and help reduce their organics load.
- Dirty cart? Save shower water in a bucket. After pickup day when your cart is empty, spray inside cart with your DIY All-Purpose Green Cleaner then pour shower water into cart. Use a mop or broom to clean the cart and let dry before loading more organic waste.

FREE COMPOSTING WORKSHOPS

Home compost systems don't produce methane gas because food and other organic wastes decompose with exposure to air. Composting at home allows you use your own ingredients, know exactly what you will put into your garden soil, and you don't have to drive anywhere to get it. If you are working with red wriggler worms, they produce castings, the prized "black gold" that is a super tonic for plant health and growth.

The County's free compost workshops teach the principles of composting kitchen and yard waste using backyard bins and vermicompost (worm composting) techniques. You will learn how compost improves your soil and the plants grown in your garden. Virtual and in-person workshops are led by a Certified Master Composter and sponsored by Santa Cruz County.
